KINGSTON ST MARY FLOWER SHOW REMINDER OF RULES AND REGULATIONS, ETC.

- Open to residents in the villages of Kingston St Mary and Broomfield and members of Kingston W.I.
- Section F is also open to Cheddon Fitzpaine residents
- All exhibits of vegetables, fruit and flowers in Classes 1 - 38 must have been grown by exhibitors in their own gardens or allotments for at least two months before the show.
- The committee reserves the right to visit all exhibitors' gardens.
- Entry fees 10p, each exhibit, minimum 50p.
- Not more than one entry may be made in any one class.
- All entry forms and fees handed in no later than 8.00pm, Thursday, 30th July.
- Staging of entries between 8.00am and 10.00am on morning of show. Exhibitors must leave the hall by 10.15am.
- Any entry which does not adhere to size stipulations, cooking instructions etc. may be disqualified.
- Not all exhibits may qualify to be put forward for judging.
- The Judges have liberty to withhold prizes for want of competition or for insufficient merit. Their decision shall be final in all cases.
- All entries are the responsibility of the entrants and not of the Flower Show Committee.
- Entries in all classes including the children's section must be the entrant's own work.

ICED COCONUT CAKE

Pre-heat oven Gas 5-6, 180-200°C

Ingredients

Cake

9 oz/ 250g butter
 9 oz/ 250g caster sugar
 4 medium eggs
 9 oz/ 250g self- raising flour
 2 oz/ 50g desiccated coconut
 (un-sweetened)

Topping

12 oz/ 310g icing sugar
 4oz/ 110g desiccated coconut
 1 tablespoons coconut milk

Method

Cake

Cream the butter and sugar
 Whisk in the beaten eggs
 Mix in the flour
 Add desiccated coconut
 Pour into a 8-9 inch tin
 Bake 40-50 minutes
 Cool

Topping

Whisk ingredients together
(add water if necessary)
 Spread onto the cooled cake

 TIN YOU PREFER
