## **KINGSTON ST MARY FLOWER SHOW REMINDER OF RULES AND REGULATIONS, ETC.**

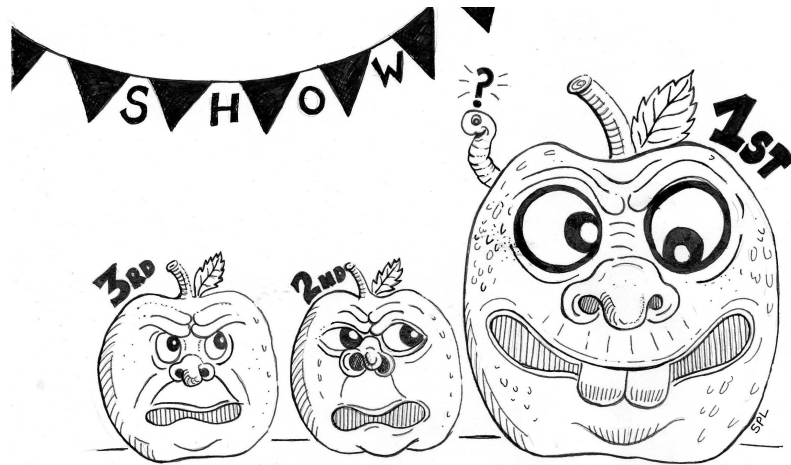
- Open to residents in the villages of Kingston St Mary and Broomfield and members of Kingston W.I.
- Section F is also open to Cheddon Fitzpaine residents.
- All exhibits of vegetables, fruit and flowers in Classes 1 - 38 must have been grown by exhibitors in their own gardens or allotments for at least two months before the show.
- The committee reserves the right to visit all exhibitors' gardens.
- Entry fees 20p, each exhibit, minimum £1.00.
- Not more than one entry may be made in any one class.
- All entry forms and fees handed in no later than 8.00pm, Thursday, 12<sup>th</sup> August 2010.
- Staging of entries between 8.00am and 10.00am on morning of show. Exhibitors must leave the hall by 10.15am.
- Any entry which does not adhere to size stipulations, cooking instructions etc. may be disqualified.
- Not all exhibits may qualify to be put forward for judging.
- The Judges have liberty to withhold prizes for want of competition or for insufficient merit. Their decision shall be final in all cases.
- All entries are the responsibility of the entrants and not of the Flower Show Committee.
- Entries in all classes including the children's section must be the entrant's own work.

### OLD-FASHIONED CHERRY CAKE

Pre-heat oven Gas 4, 350°F 180°C

#### Ingredients

8oz Butter	9oz glace cherries (quartered)
8oz Caster Sugar	4ozs ground almonds
4 large eggs (whisked)	A few drops of almond essence
8oz plain flour	2 level tbls of Demerara sugar
½ teaspoon baking powder	1 tbls milk

#### Method

Cream the butter and sugar together until light, pale and fluffy, beat in the egg a little at a time, sift the flour and baking powder together, and carefully fold this into the creamed mixture. Mix cherries with the ground almonds and fold into the cake, adding one or two drops of almond essence and the milk. Spoon the cake mix into the prepared tin, level off the top with the back of a spoon, then sprinkle with the Demerara sugar.

Bake in the centre of the oven for 1 hour, cover with foil and continue cooking for a further 30 minutes, or until the cake has shrunk away from the side of the tin and the centre is springy to touch. Cool the cake in the tin for 15 minutes before turning it out on to a wire rack to cool.
